Riverside, Iowa – The annual Sporting 150 Charity Shoot benefitting the Ronald McDonald House Charities of Eastern Iowa & Western Illinois (RMHC-EIWI) will be held Sunday, September 18, 2016 at Highland Hideaway Hunting near Riverside, Iowa.

The 11th annual charity shoot includes a fun-filled day of clay pigeon shooting, raffle prizes and camaraderie. The money that is raised at Sporting 150 benefits families and children served by the RMHC-EIWI. RMHC-EIWI exists to serve families from outside of Iowa City with children being treated at local hospitals. Its core program, the Ronald McDonald House of Iowa City, has served over 80,000 family members since opening its doors in 1985. The organization receives no state or federal tax dollars, relying 100 percent on private gifts. No families in need are turned away due to inability to pay.

Partnering with RMHC-EIWI for the Sporting 150 Charity Shoot is the Kids and Clays Foundation, a nonprofit serving Ronald McDonald Houses throughout the country by providing donated items and merchandise for Houses participating in annual Sporting Clays, Skeet and Trap events.
